Family Fun Day on the Stump Dodger Trail

Come celebrate and enjoy the Stump Dodger Trail at a Fun Day June 15, with food, games, prizes, a walk/run/ride, and other activities. A great way to celebrate Father's Day weekend!

The Fun Day, June 15 from 1 – 4 p.m., will start at the Lions Park Shelter, on Main Street near the bridge.
